SAFE:

NEVER

- Share inappropriate images with anyone.
- Meet online friends you do not know.
- Allow someone to pressure you into doing something you should not be doing.
- Give out personal information such as address, email or contact number.
- Post information online about where you are.
- Visit unreliable websites.

REMEMBER

You must protect yourself and report anything that makes you feel uncomfortable to a responsible adult or CEOP.



SOCIABLE:

ALWAYS

- Be cautious on the Internet.
- Think about what you are sharing online.
- Think of the consequences before posting online.
- Think about who may see what you post online.
- Think about others' feelings when online.
- Report online bullying: to a teacher, CEOP or a parent/carer.

REMEMBER

Online bullies, always get caught.



SECURE:

ALWAYS

- Keep your passwords safe.
- Make your passwords hard to guess.
- Have Internet security such as anti-virus software.
- Always check with a responsible adult before inputting personal information on the Internet.
- Check you have enabled the best privacy & security settings on social media accounts and games consoles.

REMEMBER

Being secure is an important way to stay safe online.



SENSIBLE:

NEVER

- Play computer games which are too old for you.
- Visit a website if you're under the age of consent.
- Post anything illegal, indecent or inappropriate online.
- Post or share anything you wouldn't want your parents, teachers or future employers to see.

REMEMBER

Every step you take online is recorded and traced back to you in seconds.
