Staff have been working hard on the timetable for 2016 -17, we have introduced several new elements that will further develop important skills for learning, employment and life. The Certificate of Personal Effectiveness (CoPE) for Keystage 4 students will offer a range of activities and personal challenges.

New qualifications for Keystage 4 students in 2016 -1 7 include: The Junior Sports leader award, a social media Btec (working with a local business) and an outdoor qualification working with colleagues from Brockholes Nature Reserve.

Our Apple educator has installed our apple server and has delivered training to school staff to develop skills in the use of the ipad within the classroom. We have purchased a new bank of the latest up to date ipads and we look forward to seeing them in action next year.

Students have been learning about how behaviour affects social situations and being sensitive to the feelings, views and needs of others. This year we have taken part in Mental Health awareness week where the focus was on relationships. Across the school pupils were focusing on random acts of kindness and how this impacts on the welfare of others. We have also been working on building resilience in our students. We have done this through building a sense of belonging and identity and will be building on this further next year. Building resilience is a way of helping our young people cope with the changes and difficulties that are a normal part of life and equipping them with the knowledge, skills and attitude to cope with adversity, preparing them for their future.

We have celebrated the fantastic success of two year 10 students who have taken their European Computer Driving Licence (ECDL) a year early. ECDL is the industry standard qualification for competency within ICT and is equivalent to a GCSE. These two student achieved an A\* and A respectively – we are so proud of them. We also have great successes in yr 11 with two students achieving a grade A and one student achieving a grade B – again so proud!

Pupils from Year 10 took part in the Borough's 'Dragons Den' competition. Presenting to the panel of judges at Youth Zone. Pupils created a presentation to make awareness of community cohesion and promote equality and diversity. Through the project called Project BBC, "Blackburn's Beautiful Colours". St Thomas's Pupils came with a unique idea and name for the project. The presentation was to raise awareness to help people build lives for people from different communities. Pupils to work with refugees and build the Blackburn community charity service.

We continue to work hard to make our school an even more effective and enjoyable place to be. We are working with our students to create a peace room in the provision that offers a place to relax. It

will have a library and lots of information to support well-being. We are also planning lots more activities and clubs such as the newly created cookery club.

We are all very pleased with the progress that has been made by our year 9 students at St Thomas this year.
